For the beginning of the school year:

We are going to ask parents to stay in their vehicles and have a staff member ask a set of

questions prior to the student leaving the vehicle.

A. The health-related questions will be:

Have you or anyone you have been in contact with had:

- 1. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- 2. Fever
- 3. Chills
- 4. Repeated shaking with chills
- 5. Runny nose or new sinus congestion
- 6. Muscle pain
- 7. Sore throat
- 8. Fatigue
- 9. New Gastrointestinal symptoms
- 10. New loss of taste or smell
- 11. Have you been out of the state or country

B. Non-health related questions:

DO YOU HAVE YOUR LUNCH AND ALL SUPPLIES TO EAT IT WITH?

We will no longer offer the use of Microwaves, supply utensils, plates napkins etc.

Do you have a water bottle; (the water fountain is closed, the bottle filler station is closed.)

Do you have a mask?

The student will then access the building where they will find a touch-free fever checking system. This is mandatory as we will be taking attendance as well. If a fever is detected the student will be sent home immediately.

Signage will be in place to show the directional flow of student traffic. Students will go immediately to first-period class, we will have online assemblies.

We will open classrooms as usual and limit class size to allow for social distancing. We will be putting up plastic guards on the desks and requiring students to wear face shield/ or masks when necessary. We will be placing students in cohorts as much as possible to limit interaction with the entire population.

If a student is at home self- quarantining or feels they may be getting sick we ask the student to log on to their classroom and participate through Google Meet. We will have a success coach to work as the intermediary between students who are distance learning and teachers.

If your child is immunocompromised and/or you do not feel they would be safe at school, we are making distance learning available. These students will be responsible for logging on to the classes and getting their work completed on time. These students will also have a success coach to ensure access to materials and documents as necessary.

Regardless of which option you are choosing the school must know where your child is each and every day. The state is monitoring absenteeism to ensure early identification of any breakouts. An email or phone call to the school is required.

I have created an online survey to determine parents' interest in education preference. Once the decision is made, it is not permanent changes can be made to accommodate students. Please remember space is limited, only students whose contracts have been returned are guaranteed placement. We have waitlisted a few classes due to high demand. Facility and Safety

Millennium Academy is taking a thorough approach to facility cleanliness.

Students will be wiping desks down prior to using them (middle and high)

Elementary students will have help from adults.

Teachers and cleaners will be sanitizing all touchpoints throughout the day. This includes doorknobs, computer keyboards, bathrooms, and sinks, etc

We will Increase the changing of AC Filters

We will maintain hand sanitizers in each classroom

Additional handwashing stations throughout the facility.

Nightly sanitizing of the facility with an Emist electrostatic sprayer.

Monthly use of Ozone generators and UV lights

At this time, we will be suspending all sports programs on campus, we are currently looking for sports that can be played without contact.

Drumline will be allowed to continue by using social distancing rules.

All policies and provisions set forth will not jeopardize and scholarship your child may have. Additional requirements for regular contact may be put in place to maintain scholarship requirements.

We take the education of your child just as seriously as we do keeping them safe and healthy. We will continue to discuss hand washing and other hygiene tips to stay safe in the classroom.
